The mission of Food for Others is to distribute food to our neighbors in need by mobilizing our giving community and volunteers.





## MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIR

Since 1995, Food for Others has been a place to turn for families facing a crisis that leaves them unable to afford food. Now, we are a place to turn for the nearly 100,000 Northern Virginians facing food insecurity as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic.

At the start of FY20, we were prepared for a year of celebration for our 25th anniversary. When the pandemic spread to our region, our plans quickly changed. Though more families than ever were suddenly struggling to afford food, the Food for Others community responded, proving its dedication to our 25-year mission: feeding our neighbors in times of need.

Right away, restaurants, catering companies, and closed offices delivered food they could no longer use. Volunteers who could no longer work in the warehouse hosted contactless food drives with their neighborhoods or treated the FFO staff to lunch from a local restaurant. Many of you donated online. Our local and state representatives helped spread the word among their constituents. Families planted vegetable and herb gardens to donate to families in need. We continued gleaning fresh produce at farms and farmers markets. Local bands even played socially distanced driveway concerts and dropped off tip jars full of cash donations. **All of these efforts helped to sustain FFO and its clients through a difficult period during which supply lines and normal sources of donated food were highly disrupted.**

Together, we've been on the frontlines of the crisis. With your help, Food for Others has remained open and serving families every weekday but one since the pandemic started.

### Here are some of the ways we've responded to the increased need for food:

- Between March and June of 2020, Food for Others served 60,316 individuals from our Merrifield warehouse compared to 14,239 for the same period in the previous year, a 324% increase.
- We are distributing more food to our 17 existing community partners and we are providing large food orders to seven new community partners.
- FFO has added nine pop-up mobile pantries in areas of high-need which will be easier to access for people who cannot make it to our warehouse during normal operating hours.

Though the number of families needing food due to COVID-19 remains high, there is so much hope. Emergency response is not how we intended to spend our 25th year, but we are passionate about feeding our neighbors in need in partnership with you, our incredible community. Together, we've got this.

PROGRAMS & SERVICES

Food for Others was founded in 1995 with a mission to distribute free food to our neighbors in need by mobilizing our giving community and volunteers. Food insecurity affects more than 70,000 people in Northern Virginia, including 1 in 13 children. Our work ensures that families throughout the region can still access fresh and nutritious foods when their paychecks are stretched thin from covering other expenses like housing, healthcare, and transportation. Food for Others partners with social workers, community organizations, the Capital Area Food Bank, schools, clinics, and Fairfax County to identify low income families facing food insecurity and refer them to our services. This year, we piloted a mobile emergency food pantry in order to reach families who cannot access our warehouse due to lack of transportation or scheduling conflicts. The mobile pantry in Annandale provided all of the same benefits as the warehouse emergency program but was much easier to access for clients. As the economic impacts of the pandemic continue, we will be adding eight more mobile pantry locations throughout Northern Virginia in FY21.

4 WAYS TO FIGHT HUNGER

1 EMERGENCY FOOD OPERATIONS

Emergency Food operations at our warehouse (open Monday-Friday, 9:30am-5pm) and mobile food pantries (open weekday evenings) provide 3-5 days' worth of non-perishables as well as milk, eggs, and other fresh foods to people referred to Food for Others by Fairfax County Coordinated Services Planning and various social service providers. Generally, clients shop for their food in "My Market" but to minimize contact, we have temporarily switched to pre-made boxes. Clients who qualify based on income eligibility may also receive monthly food supplements that we order on their behalf from USDA. In FY20, FFO distributed emergency food 27,394 times.



2 NEIGHBORHOOD SITE DISTRIBUTIONS



Neighborhood Site distributions provide food to individuals and families via volunteers who pick up supplemental food at our warehouse and deliver it to low-income neighborhoods. This occurs every evening, Monday through Friday, serving 16 sites.

3 COMMUNITY PARTNERS PROGRAM

The Community Partners program provides bulk food items to 17 community partners on a weekly or bi-weekly basis. This includes faith-based organizations, youth shelters and other groups serving at-risk residents facing food insecurity in Northern Virginia. During the COVID-19 emergency, we distributed food to 16 additional non-profit partners.



4 POWER PACK PROGRAM - P3

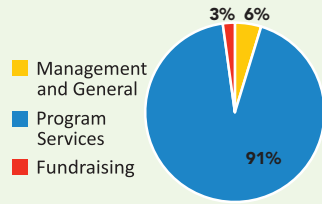


The Power Pack Program (P3) provides weekend backpack food to more than 2,000 students at 33 Fairfax County public schools who have been identified by school social workers and teachers as in need of supplemental food.

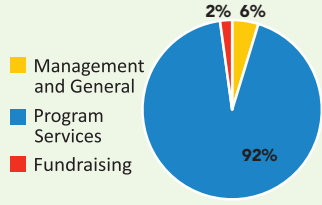
Financial Statement of Position Fiscal Year July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020

Food for Others experienced a dramatic increase in demand for services in the last quarter of FY2020 due to the Covid-19 pandemic. FFO hired seven temporary staff members to compensate for the loss of volunteers and spent more on food, supplies, and transportation. At the same time, FFO benefited from an increase in contributions. Overall net assets increased by \$1,483,599. FFO maintains a healthy cash and investment balance with approximately 23 months of operating expenses in reserve.

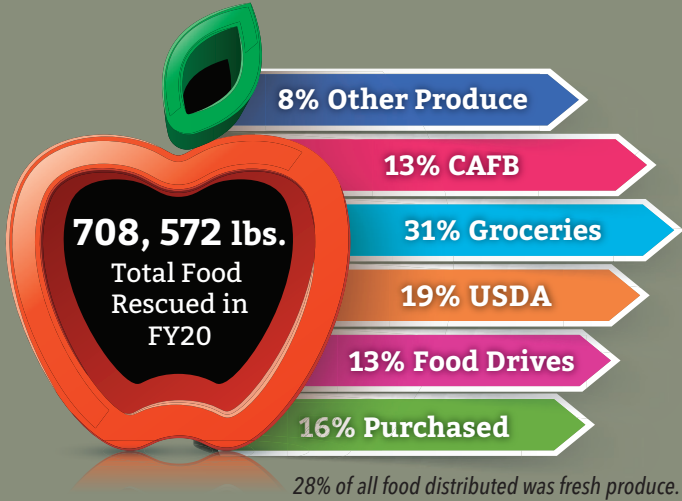

# In FY2020

In FY2020, people from the counties of Arlington, Fairfax, Loudoun, and Prince William and the cities of Falls Church, Alexandria, Manassas and Manassas Park received food from Food for Others. Clients were primarily from Fairfax County, home to more than 1.1 million people, where 6% live in poverty.
