Welcome and Commission Business

Sofia welcomed the group and provided meeting logistics. The interpreters provided information on how to access interpretation.

Sofia informed the group that Co-chairs Porta and Ketah have offered to continue to serve as co-chairs until the end of the Commission's term (December 3, 2022).

Vote to confirm to extend term of Commissioners Porta and Ketah as co-chairs until the end of the Commission's term. 11 commissioners confirmed.

Co-chair Porta welcomed the group and provided an overview of the meeting agenda, upcoming timeline, and public comments recently submitted.

Vote to approve minutes of October 3 and 11, 2022 full commission meetings. 11 commissioners approved.

Diana N. informed the group that at the August 30th meeting a proposal from the Office of Management and Finance regarding the City's ability to raise revenue. There was confusion regarding the vote, in that only nine commissioners voted yes but eleven are required to move proposals forward, meaning it does not pass. However, at the time facilitator incorrectly stated that the motion passed. Comm. Chen provided an overview of the proposal. Group discussed

what authority a bureau may have regarding raising taxes versus the City Council's authority to raise taxes. Group was not interested in taking a new vote on this proposal.

Timeline and Approach

Diana N. provided information on the upcoming timeline.

Proposals and Votes

<u>Proposal #1</u> – Delete the charter provision that prohibits the City from mandating weatherization of structures built before September 1, 1979.

Vote to release the redline as drafted for community input through public comment and public hearings, request the City Attorney's Office to draft a brief impartial narrative summarizing the proposal, and request the City Budget Office conduct a fiscal impact analysis. 13 Commissioners voted yes.

<u>Proposal #2</u> - Update language to reflect the City's and Portland Parks & Recreation's role in protecting, restoring, and enhancing natural systems and natural areas, including the urban forest, rivers and streams, to mitigate against the public heath, economic, and threats of climate change, biodiversity loss and invasive species.

Vote to release the redline as drafted for community input through public comment and public hearings, request the City Attorney's Office to draft a brief impartial narrative summarizing the proposal, and request the City Budget Office conduct a fiscal impact analysis. 12 Commissioners voted yes.

<u>Proposal #3</u> - Add as one of the City's specific powers and amend the City's authority regarding its sewage disposal and purification system to include various specific actions related to the protection and management of water, sewage and stormwater.

Vote to release the redline as drafted for community input through public comment and public hearings, request the City Attorney's Office to draft a brief impartial narrative summarizing the proposal, and request the City Budget Office conduct a fiscal impact analysis. 12 Commissioners voted yes.

<u>Proposal #4</u> - Delete the charter provision granting the City the power and authority "to prohibit persons from roaming the streets at unseasonable hours."

Vote to release the redline as drafted for community input through public comment and public hearings, request the City Attorney's Office to draft a brief impartial narrative summarizing the proposal, and request the City Budget Office conduct a fiscal impact analysis. 14 Commissioners voted yes.

<u>Proposal #5</u> - Remove the reference to "offensive" businesses in the City's power and authority to regulate, restrain and to provide for the exclusion from the City trades, occupations or

businesses which may in the opinion of the Council create or constitute a nuisance and to regulate uses of land and structures within the City.

Vote to release the redline as drafted for community input through public comment and public hearings, request the City Attorney's Office to draft a brief impartial narrative summarizing the proposal, and request the City Budget Office conduct a fiscal impact analysis. 13 commissioners voted yes.

<u>Proposal #6</u> - Remove outdated, burdensome, and redundant requirements for franchise agreements.

Vote to release the redline as drafted for community input through public comment and public hearings, request the City Attorney's Office to draft a brief impartial narrative summarizing the proposal, and request the City Budget Office conduct a fiscal impact analysis. 13 commissioners voted yes.

Proposal #7 - Remove the 5% cap on transient lodgings tax imposed by the City.

Vote to release the redline as drafted for community input through public comment and public hearings, request the City Attorney's Office to draft a brief impartial narrative summarizing the proposal, and request the City Budget Office conduct a fiscal impact analysis. 13 commissioners voted yes.

<u>Proposal #8</u> - Increase claims negotiation, compromise and settlement authority from \$5,000 to \$25,000. Payments exceeding \$25,000 must be authorized by ordinance. Amend Charter Section 1-106. *only if voters do not approve phase I recommendations which include a proposed increase.

Vote to release the redline as drafted for community input through public comment and public hearings, request the City Attorney's Office to draft a brief impartial narrative summarizing the proposal, and request the City Budget Office conduct a fiscal impact analysis. 14 commissioners voted yes.

<u>Proposal #10</u> - Require the City to extend the right to vote, including to noncitizens, to the fullest extent allowed by law and require the City to conduct periodic voter education campaigns.

Vote to release the redline as drafted for community input through public comment and public hearings, request the City Attorney's Office to draft a brief impartial narrative summarizing the proposal, and request the City Budget Office conduct a fiscal impact analysis. 14 commissioners voted yes.

<u>Proposal #11</u> - Update and make consistent references to "protected classes" in the Charter

City Attorney Haium clarified that in Section 12-102, the new language should say, "...protected class under local ordinance, or state or federal law...".

Vote to release the redline as drafted for community input through public comment and public hearings, request the City Attorney's Office to draft a brief impartial narrative summarizing the proposal, and request the City Budget Office conduct a fiscal impact analysis. 12 commissioners voted yes.

<u>Proposal #13</u> – Creation of the Independent Portland Elections Commission.

City Attorney Haium outlined the language as drafted. Comm. Chen uplifted community input from the League of Women Voters regarding desired requirements for the Independent Elections Commission. He urged the Commission to reconsider including exclusions for Commission membership. Group discussed what elements of commission rules are more appropriate to be included in code rather than Charter. Group determined that they want more public input before they consider any additional edits.

Vote to release the redline as drafted for community input through public comment and public hearings, request the City Attorney's Office to draft a brief impartial narrative summarizing the proposal, and request the City Budget Office conduct a fiscal impact analysis. 11 commissioners voted yes.

<u>Proposal #12</u> - Replace "disability" with "incapacity" and "disabled" with "incapacitated" when referencing an elected official's inability to perform their duties.

Vote to release the redline as drafted for community input through public comment and public hearings, request the City Attorney's Office to draft a brief impartial narrative summarizing the proposal, and request the City Budget Office conduct a fiscal impact analysis. 12 commissioners voted yes.

<u>Proposal #14</u> – Climate Commitment

City Attorney Haium outlined the language she drafted. Comm. Chen suggested moving "best available science" to the end of both the second and third sentences of Section 11-1102 to ensure that best available was not qualifying the words 'environmental justice', 'public health', or 'seismic resiliency'.

Comm. Lewis requested additional language around a fossil fuels phase out. He proposed including, "Consistent with prior sections, it is the policy of the City of Portland to oppose all new fossil fuel infrastructure and manage the decline of existing fossil fuel use in the city, in line with the City's climate action goals and the imperatives of climate science, public health, and seismic resilience. The city shall prioritize environmental justice in the implementation of this section, which will apply to all city decisions to the maximum extent allowed by law."

Comm. Streeter proposed having the public react to both the drafted redline language and the language proposed by Comm. Lewis. Comm. Kitchen raised concerns with Comm. Lewis' proposed language due to the possibility that it may be mis-used and could limit, for example, safety upgrades, if they are considered new infrastructure. Several on commission agreed with concerns of unintended consequences for both development limitations as well as unintended harm to communities already most impacted by climate change. Others desired to include the language as the state is already moving in this direction and including it would help move that commitment along.

Comm Reddy stated she would like to have language mandating the City to have a climate action plan. City Attorney Haium discussed possible ways she could add that requirement to the draft language.

Vote to amend the current redline draft to add a requirement for the city to have climate action goals. 13 commissioners voted yes.

Vote to additionally amend the current redline by adding Comm. Lewis' proposed language. 10 commissioners voted yes. Amendment does not pass.

Group discussed if Comm. Lewis' language could be modified to avoid unintended consequences. Group determined they would move forward with current redline language and allow community to give input on potential recommendations for future consideration.

Vote to move redline language as amended to include Comm. Chen's sentence structure edits and a requirement for the city to have climate action goals for input through public comment and public hearings, request the City Attorney's Office to draft a brief impartial narrative summarizing the proposal, and request the City Budget Office determine whether the proposal has fiscal impact and, if so, to conduct a fiscal impact analysis. 14 commissioners voted yes.

<u>Proposal #9</u> - Require the City to create by ordinance a participatory budgeting program open to all residents.

Diana N. reminded group of discussion held at the last meeting regarding this proposal. City Attorney Haium outlined the redlined language.

Group asked questions of City Budget Officer, Jessica Kinard, regarding the memo she submitted.

- In the memo you refer to one-time, available forecasted revenues and that half goes to deferred maintenance what does the other half go for? It goes to the General Fund, and is supposed to be for one-time projects, but that does not always occur.
- Concerned about the program being set up as one-time funding. What's difference between General Fund and General Fund Discretionary resources? Some General Fund resources are required to be spent in specific ways, whereas discretionary funds are not

- restricted in the same way. The participatory budgeting process is unlikely to be able to fund on-going programs because the funding of those on-going projects would automatically limit available funds for any new projects.
- Participatory budgeting should be imbedded in the budget-development process, not be
 a process occurring after the budget has already been determined. It's about having city
 services reflect community priorities.
- You suggest not using general fund dollars but instead consider using capital planning resources. What would that look like? Many jurisdictions use participatory budgeting to allocate capital planning resources, rather than on-going general fund resources.
- How would the participatory budgeting program affect bureau budget advisory committees? In general, they would be unaffected.
- If we have participatory budgeting set up using general fund discretionary on-going resources, could a participatory budgeting group advise the city as to where cuts could be taken or where resources may be re-allocated from? This may run in conflict with Oregon Budget law's requirement that the Council be the budget decision-maker. They could make recommendations as to where funding would go, but not where those resources were taken from.

Concerns raised that the proposal as written may go against Oregon budget law. City Attorney Haium stated that because it is written with a specific fund identified, it does not run against Oregon budget law.

Concerns raised about having participatory budgeting be focused on one-time projects, rather than on-going resources. Comm. Lewis stated that participatory budgeting used in cities across the world and at a much higher budget amounts. They almost all begin with one-time projects, which can then be moved to be on-going if they are proved affective. It's about giving the community the opportunity to inform the budget process with their priorities.

Vote to amend drafted redline language to have the minimum about be no less than 1%. 11 commissioners voted yes.

Vote to move redline language as amended community input through public comment and public hearings, request the City Attorney's Office to draft a brief impartial narrative summarizing the proposal, and request the City Budget Office determine whether the proposal has fiscal impact and, if so, to conduct a fiscal impact analysis. 14 commissioners voted yes.

<u>Proposal #15</u> - Public Engagement as a city value City Attorney Haium outlined the language she drafted.

Comm. Chen stated that conceptually he agrees with the idea but is unclear what value this actually adds. Comm. Avalos stated it's about reinforcing the value of public engagement, regardless of what occurs with the ballot in November. Comm. Chimuku stated it's a way to help community require the City do things like make meetings more accessible, such as live

interpreters. Comm. Speer stated that having this helps bridge some of the gap of lack of community trust in city government. Comm. Streeter stated it is important to memorialize in Charter that this value is important to the community and to stop missing out on opportunities for public input from historically left out communities.

Vote to release the redline as drafted for community input through public comment and public hearings, request the City Attorney's Office to draft a brief impartial narrative summarizing the proposal, and request the City Budget Office determine whether the proposal has fiscal impact and, if so, to conduct a fiscal impact analysis. 11 commissioners voted yes.

Next Steps

Co-chair Ketah provided an overview of next steps, including timing of redline release, and public hearings on November 17 and 19. Written public comment on the redlines will close on November 28th at 7:00 a.m.

Next commission meeting is scheduled for November 29, 2022.
