HB 20 REP MIGUEZ Prohibits the use of private funds to pay election-related expenses

SUPPORT STATUS: Pending House and Governmental Affairs

HB 37 REP BACALA Post adoption supervision in both agency and private adoptions

SUPPORT STATUS: Passed the House

HB 61 REP HODGES Requires taxpayers who claim the earned income tax credit to affirm that a qualifying

child for which the credit is claimed was physically present in the U.S. for at least half the

tax year.

STATUS: Pending House Ways and Means

HB 222 REP STEFANSKI Prohibits computer solicitation of a minor

SUPPORT STATUS: Pending House Administration of Criminal Justice

HB 255 REP C OWEN Limits the ability of a legal caretaker to force abortion for a person in his/her care.

SUPPORT STATUS: Pending House Civil Law and Procedure

HB 273 REP BEAULLIEU Constitutional amendment to limit the amount of growth in state expenditures

SUPPORT STATUS: Pending House Appropriations

HB 280 REP EDMONDS Revises eligibility criteria for school participation in the Student Scholarships for

Educational Excellence Program and removes the program enrollment cap (20%) applicable

to certain schools.

STATUS: Pending House Education

HB 349 REP EDMONSTON Prohibits the office of motor vehicles from including vaccination verification or immunity

status on a driver's license or state identification card and from using such records for the issuance, renewal, or revocation of a driver's license or state identification card. See also

HB 103, HB 498, and SB 198.

STATUS: Pending House Transportation, Highways, and Public Works

HB 352 REP HODGES Requires further instruction on the nation's founding principles in required American

history and civics courses in public schools.

STATUS: Pending House Education

HB 357 REP CREWS Increases the amount of information regarding minors required for abortion reporting.

SUPPORT STATUS: Pending House Health and Welfare

HB 416 REP HODGES SUPPORT STATUS:	Requires instruction regarding World War II and the Holocaust for middle and high school students and training for teachers relative to such instruction. Pending House Education
HB 423 REP EMERSON	Expanded information required in abortion reporting for statistical purposes.
SUPPORT STATUS:	Pending House Health and Welfare
HB 426 REP AMEDEE	Provides relative to visitation of nursing home residents and assisted living facility
SUPPORT STATUS:	residents by persons designated as essential caregivers or compassionate care visitors. Pending House Health and Welfare
HB 494 REP MINCEY	Greater freedom for parents in moving child to a different school even if that school is out
SUPPORT	of their school district. Requires a written agreement between affected public school governing authorities and a parent for a student to attend the public school of his choice.

HB 542 REP AMEDEE	Prohibits a team designated for females, girls, or women from being open to students who

HB 564 REP GAROFALO SUPPORT STATUS:	Prohibits training provided to students or employees in grades K-12 which teaches, advocates, acts upon, or promotes divisive concepts relative to race and sex in any schools receiving state funding. Pending House Education

HB 575 REP FIRMENT SUPPORT STATUS:	Prohibits drugs or surgery for minors whose biological sex is perceived to be inconsistent with minor's desired sex. See also SB 104 by Sen. Fesi. Pending House Health and Welfare
HB 578 REP AMEDEE	Requires abortionist to disclose to patient that abortion drug is reversible.
SUPPORT STATUS:	Pending House Health and Welfare
HB 579 REP AMEDEE SUPPORT STATUS:	Provides for rights of individuals to bodily autonomy and to make healthcare decisions, prohibits the state and its political subdivisions from interfering with such rights, and authorizes enforcement actions to protect those rights. Pending House Health and Welfare
HCR 5 REP MCCORMICK	Religious freedom during declared emergencies such as COVID 19.

SB 156 SEN MIZELL	Prohibits a team designated for females, girls, or women from being open to students who
SUPPORT	are not biologically female.
STATUS:	Pending Senate Education
SB 170 SEN JOHNS	Centralizes state's human trafficking efforts in the office of the Governor.
SUPPORT STATUS:	Pending Senate floor action

OPPOSE	STATUS:	preferences (including preferred pronouns) in the foster care system. Pending Senate Health and Welfare
SB 155	SEN BOUIE	Social Work Practice Act: No license, certificate, or registration shall be denied any
OPPOSE		applicant based upon the applicant's sexual orientation, gender expression.

SB 202 OPPOSE	SEN CORTEZ	Regulation of sports betting previously approved on a parish by parish basis by the voters. Would allow sports betting on mobile devices, in bars and restaurants around the state as
OFFOSE		well as in other gambling venues. See also SB 195 and HB 628.
