It was exciting to find a new plant to me today, Fatoua villosa, or mulberry weed. This is a relatively new plant to the state and, judging from what folks have to say about it in other states, it will likely spread fast. I pulled the plant and have it in the press currently to go in the IU herbarium. EDDmaps report is completed. It was in a garden bed that was established using leaves from random residences in town, which is where I suspect it came from. Be on the lookout!
