

Housing Counselor

JOB SUMMARY

CPAH is looking for compassionate people who want to make a difference and help ensure that everyone has a place to call home. The primary responsibility of the Housing Counselor is to provide housing counseling and education to tenants, first-time homebuyers, existing homeowners, and homeowners facing foreclosure, as well as helping to administer foreclosure prevention funds. The Housing Counselor teaches group classes and provides one-on-one counseling to help low- and moderate-income households overcome barriers to homeownership, improve credits scores, reduce debt, establish budgets, qualify for a mortgage, prevent foreclosure, and achieve long-term housing stability and financial security. CPAH specifically works to help remedy the historical impacts of housing discrimination. The position reports to the Director of Counseling and Education.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Provide one-on-one rental counseling, pre-purchase housing counseling, financial capability counseling, and mortgage delinquency counseling
- Teach pre- and post-purchase group education classes and financial capability classes (both inperson and virtually)
- Help administer foreclosure prevention financial assistance programs
- Complete required data entry, activity logs, filing, and reporting that is necessary to maintain compliance with grants and the organization's HUD housing counseling certification
- Continually develop required job knowledge, skills, and core professional competencies
- Perform other duties as assigned by the Director of Counseling and Education

STANDARDS AND CORE COMPETENCIES

- Bachelor's degree or equivalent required
- Minimum of 2 years of experience in the housing counseling, finance, real estate, or related field
- Solid understanding of rental housing, the home-buying process, mortgages, and foreclosures
- Strong public speaking and presentation skills
- Strong interpersonal skills and the ability to communicate effectively and compassionately with clients, many of whom may be in stressful situations
- Very detailed, organized, and accurate
- Strong computer skills and ability to learn new technology
- Must possess a passion for CPAH's mission
- HUD-certified housing counselor or willingness to become HUD-certified within 12 months
- Bilingual (Spanish) a plus

SCHEDULING & COMPENSATION

CPAH's standard office hours are Monday through Friday 8:30am – 5:00pm. Up to 2 days per week may be worked from home. The role requires occasional evening and weekend hours. Competitive salary of \$55,000 - \$62,000, commensurate with experience and HUD Housing Counselor Certification. Generous benefits include vacation, sick, health, dental, life, disability, and 401K match.
