<u>What Is A Speakers'</u> <u>Bureau?</u>

Individuals willing and knowledgeable to be COVID-19 vaccine ambassadors and give educational talks in Chicago communities about vaccine myths, hesitancies and personal experiences with vaccinations. Speakers present at community events hosted by the Chicago Department of Public Health

<u>What Topics Will</u> <u>The Speakers'</u> <u>Bureau Cover?</u>

Members will receive a stipend for each speaking engagement they participate in.

Topics can include:

- 1. The importance of getting vaccinated, including obtaining boosters vaccines
- 2. Community perspective on vaccines
- 3. Community needs during the COVID-19 pandemic
- 4. Personal experiences with vaccines

In addition to the above topics, programs can be customized to support the needs of the audience.





The Speakers Bureau is composed of community members and Health Care workers who are knowledgeable and willing to speak publicly about the importance of COVID-19 vaccines and boosters.

Who can become a speakers bureau member?

- 1.Be a vaccine ambassador and promote the importance of vaccines.
- 2.Speak at programs for Health Care workers.
- 3. Speak at community outreach programs.
- 4. Provide feedback for programming.
- 5.Be available with one week notice to speak at an event between November 2022 and June 2023.

Speakers' Bureau members may be asked to present at one or more events between November 2022 and June 2023.
