<b>HR 2199</b> Carbajal (D-CA)	Central Coast Heritage Protection Act	Passed full House 12 Feb. 2020. H. Rpt. 116-390.	Designates 250,000 acres on the Los Padres National Forest in CA as Wilderness. Expands 9 Wildernesses on Los Padres NF, and designates 4 new Wildernesses on Carrizo Plain Natl Monument. <b>Full of bad special provisions: buffer zones, military overflights, horses, hydrologic/meteorological/climatological collection devices, 2 existing water diversion/transport facilities and their roads, and an electrical distribution line in San Rafael Wilderness addition. Also incorporates bad wildlife practices from bad House Report 101-405. S. 1111 is companion.</b>

Also incorporates bad wildlife practices from bad House Report 101-405. CONTAINS NEW SPECIAL PROVISION LEGALIZING PERMANENT FIXED CLIMBING ANCHORS IN WILDERNESS. S. 1110 is companion.</b>
<b>HR 2532</b> Grijalva (D-AZ)	Tribal Heritage and Grizzly Protection Act	Subcommittee hearing held 15 May 2019; referred to Ag subcommittee.	Not strictly a wilderness bill. Except for narrow circumstances, it would be unlawful “to take, possess, or

			transport a grizzly bear, or any part thereof.” The bill would not apply to any population of grizzlies that are listed as threatened or endangered under the Endangered Species Act. (In other words, would protect grizzlies even if they are taken off the threatened or endangered species lists.) Establishes a Grizzly Bear Scientific Committee to carry out expert consultations and scientific studies specified by this Act. Requires tribal consultation, and allows tribes to reintroduce grizzlies on tribal lands. Prohibits predator control measures if they might result in the inadvertent taking of grizzlies.

<b>HR 2579</b> Grijalva (D-AZ)	Hardrock Leasing and Reclamation Act of 2019	Passed Natural Resources Committee 23 October 2019.	Extensive language reforming/replacing the 1872 Mining Act. For existing mining claims in Wilderness, the bill contains provisions whereby those claims will become invalid and void after 10 years if no plan of operation has been approved. <b>HR 4547</b> Case (D-HI)	Safe and Quiet Skies Act	Referred to Transportation Committee	Among other things, this bill would prohibit commercial air tours from operating within a half mile of units of the National Wilderness Preservation System. <i>S. 3967 is companion.</i>
<b>HR 5474</b> Bishop (R-UT)	Shawnee Wilderness Area Designation Act	Referred to Ag and NR Committees	Would designate 289,000 acres of Shawnee National Forest lands in southern IL as Wilderness. Appears to be a tit-for-tat for Durbin introducing America's Red Rock Wilderness Act in UT. <i>S. 3075 is companion.</i> Bill is free of special provisions.
<b>HR 5598</b> McCollum (D-MN)	Boundary Waters Wilderness Protection and Pollution Prevention Act	Subcommittee hearing 5 Feb. 2020	Withdraws federal lands and minerals in 234,328-acre Rainy River watershed from mineral exploration and development, to protect Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness and Voyageurs National Park from mining pollution.
<b>HR 5606</b> Horsford (D-NV)	Desert National Wildlife Refuge	Referred to NR and Armed Forces Committees	Would give the military 98,000 acres of the Desert National Wildlife Refuge, but would designate 8 Wildernesses totaling 1.31 million acres elsewhere on the Refuge as Wilderness. <b>Includes buffer zone, military overflights, and guzzler special provisions.</b> <i>S. 3145 is companion.</i>
<b>HR 5714</b> Tipton (R-CO)	<b>Safeguarding Readiness in Military Aviation Training Act</b>	Referred to Armed Services Committee	<b>Directs Sec. of Defense to conduct a study on the impacts that the expansion of wilderness designations in the Western US would have on readiness of Armed Forces with respect to aviation training and other purposes.</b>
<b>HR 5737</b> Smith (D-WA)	Voluntary Grazing Permit Retirement Act	Referred to NR Committee	Would provide federal public lands commercial grazing permit holders the option to relinquish their commercial grazing permits in exchange for compensation paid by private parties. The federal agency would then be directed to permanently retire the associated commercial grazing allotment from any further commercial livestock grazing activity. This bill has the potential to begin eliminating the

			harmful effects of livestock grazing within designated Wildernesses as well as other federal public lands.

<b>HR 5999</b> Huffman (D-CA)	Arctic Coastal Plain Wilderness	Referred to NR Committee	Would designate the 1.55 million-acre coastal plain of the Arctic National Wildlife Refuge in AK as Wilderness. <i>S. 2461 is companion.</i>
<b>HR 6228</b> Amodei (R-NV)	<b>Northern Nevada Economic Development and Conservation Act</b>	Referred to Natural Resources, Veterans' Affairs, and Agriculture Committees	Combines several NV bills dealing with Douglas, Pershing, and Lander Counties. Would designate the 12,392-acre Burbank Canyons Wilderness in Douglas Co., and would designate 7 wildernesses in Pershing Co. totaling 136,072 acres. <b>Contains very bad wilderness special provisions for military overflight, buffers, guzzlers and other wildlife water installations, aircraft and motor vehicles for wildlife, climatological data collection stations, water rights, non-native weeds, and allows a telecommunications device/tower in the Selenite Peak Wilderness. Would designate 12,392-acre Burbank Canyons Wilderness in Douglas Co. Would designate 7 Wildernesses in Pershing Co. totaling 136,072 acres. <b>Contains really bad wilderness special provisions for military overflight, buffers, guzzlers and other wildlife water installations, aircraft and motor vehicles for wildlife, climatological data collection stations, water rights, non-native weeds.
