Oregon has 43 NAWCA projects either completed or underway. These projects have conserved 114,913 acres of wildlife habitat. NAWCA funding of more than \$21.4 million stimulated partner contributions of over \$81.3 million. These figures do not include multi-state projects.

WILLAMFTTE VALLEY PARTNERSHIP I

Situated between the Coast Range to the west and Cascade Mountains to the east, the Willamette Valley is a long, flat floodplain that historically supported over 600,000 acres of wetlands and now contains a high proportion of decreasing wetlands. This project is phase one of an effort to create a waterfowl migration and wintering corridor in the valley. It will develop four wetland complexes, protecting 460 acres and restoring 490 acres of wetlands in Ankeny National Wildlife Refuge, three state wildlife management areas and adjacent privately-owned lands.
