Dear Republican Members of Congress:

Recent news reports indicate that Speaker Pelosi may bring both the \$1.2 trillion “Green New Deal/Infrastructure” bill and the “Big Government Socialism/Reconciliation” bill to a vote as early as this week. This would be one of the greatest abuses of power in American history, as no member of Congress would fully know or have had time to read what is in the bills.



Both bills would result in a massive increase in the size and scope of the government and will do so for years. Earlier this year Democrats gave states nearly \$2 trillion of federal money. Now states are flush with cash. With inflation hurting lower and middle-income Americans, more spending at the federal level would be unwise at this time.



These two spending bills are joined at the hip. Support for one indicates support for both. Passing the Green New Deal/Infrastructure bill is a gateway to passing the Big Government Socialism/Reconciliation bill, which would undermine so much of the progress our conservative movement has made over the past four years. When the federal government is spending \$2 trillion more each year than it collects in revenues, Congress should be focusing its efforts to find ways to SAVE hundreds of billions of dollars, not spending trillions more.



The financial health of our Nation is in jeopardy from the cascade of President Biden’s dangerous policy provisions and multi-trillion-dollar spending bills. These bills could fuel further inflation, and the tax increases attached to these bills will impair American economic competitiveness. We are confident that your Members could write much better legislation that builds REAL infrastructure and helps the economy, small businesses, and families.
