Requires each board of education to adopt policy establishing temperature control standards and guidelines for school district facilities.

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AN ACT concerning temperature control of public school buildings 1 2 and supplementing chapter 33 of Title 18A of the New Jersey 3 Statutes. 4 5 **BE IT ENACTED** by the Senate and General Assembly of the State 6 of New Jersey: 7 8 1. Each board of education shall adopt a policy establishing 9 temperature control standards and guidelines for school district facilities. The policy shall ensure, to the greatest extent feasible, 10 that school buildings provide students with a temperature-controlled 11 12 environment that is conducive to learning. The policy shall: 13 require, in each school building in the district, that a staff a. 14 member be designated to monitor compliance with the standards 15 and initiate permitted corrective measures; b. establish a protocol to follow in instances where classroom 16 17 temperatures are identified as being not conducive to learning; 18 identify what temperature control measures are permitted in c. 19 accordance with local building and fire codes; d. be informed by the temperature standards outlined in 20 N.J.A.C.12:100-13.3(a)4 of the Indoor Air Quality Standard 21 22 established by the Department of Labor and Workforce 23 Development; and 24 require corrective measures be addressed, where feasible, by e. 25 action outlined in N.J.A.C.12:100-13.3(a)1 of the Indoor Air Quality Standard established by the Department of Labor and 26 Workforce Development. 27 28 29 The Department of Education and the Department of Health 2. 30 shall jointly develop guidance to assist school districts in establishing and implementing a policy concerning temperature 31 32 control. 33 34 3. This act shall take effect on July 1 of the school year 35 following enactment. 36 37 38 **STATEMENT** 39 This bill requires each board of education to adopt a policy 40 establishing temperature control standards and guidelines for school 41 district facilities. The policy must ensure, to the greatest extent 42 43 feasible, that school buildings provide students with a temperature-44 controlled environment that is conducive to learning.
