Regulate it!

Steps to protect kids from marijuana commercialization¹





- Marijuana-free zones²
 - a 1,000 feet from schools, preschools, daycare centers and youth-serving facilities³
 - **b** 1,000 feet from public parks and recreation centers
 - c 500 feet from residences, residential use
 - **d** Main entrance signage
- 2 Local enforcement of regularly scheduled checks of age restrictions⁴
- Prohibit the sale of products that appeal to kids, ex: edibles that resemble store candy, flavored vaping liquid, products that hide marijuana, unmarked edibles
- Set potency limits; high concentrations of THC, the psychoactive ingredient in marijuana, are associated with higher rates of psychiatric disorders, such as schizophrenia, psychosis, and generalized anxiety⁵



Regulate it!

Steps to protect kids from marijuana commercialization



- Set sales limits, prohibit the practice of "looping" (repeat purchases under the legal limit from the same store on the same day, a practice that supplies the black market)⁶
- 6 Limit industry advertising; no outdoor or billboard advertising⁷
- 7 Limit outlet density and total number of licenses®
- 8 Limit hours of operation⁹
- 9 Track adverse events such as attempted looping and underage purchases through mandatory reporting by licensees; require licensees to confiscate fake IDs
