

The Vermont Early Childhood Advocacy Alliance is a statewide coalition of early childhood professionals and providers, parents, organizations, and businesses working together to improve public policies that impact children from birth to age eight and families in the areas of health, safety, food security, economic security, and early care and education.

To achieve this goal, the Alliance focuses on the creation and support of an annual Legislative Agenda in the Vermont legislature. The Agenda includes priority issues for the coalition's diverse voices from around the state.



Let's Grow Kids' mission is to ensure affordable access to high-quality child care for all Vermont families. We know that child care is essential to Vermonters, but even before the pandemic, 3 out of 5 of Vermont's youngest children did not have access to the care they needed. COVID-19 has only exacerbated already pressing challenges for families, early childhood educators, and employers. Equitable access to a high-quality and affordable child care system will enable Vermont support young families, grow its workforce, and set its youngest residents up for future success in school, relationships, work, and life.

On January 28th, Let's Grow Kids officially launched a three-year legislative campaign to achieve accessible, affordable, high-quality early childhood education for all families. Let's Grow Kids is now collaborating with Let's Grow Kids Action Network (LGKAN), its newly formed 501(c)(4) affiliate, to spearhead the community organizing and political accountability needed to drive our 3-year legislative campaign to fund and support a sustainable and equitable child care system in Vermont. With support from champions across the state, we are working to ensure every Vermont child has equal opportunity to learn, thrive, and reach their full potential.
