Originally launched in 2012, the Landscape Alternatives app has been downloaded thousands of times. It is designed to help homeowners identify invasive plants that might be lurking in their yards, water gardens, home aquariums, or at the nearest big-box store, and choose suitable, non-invasive substitutes. The alternatives are matched by ornamental features shared in common with the invasive plant. Just like with the original app, MIPN developed the new content with help from Midwestern stakeholders from different backgrounds, including representatives from nurseries, botanical gardens & arboreta, and conservation organizations.
