Job Announcement: Comunidades Program Director

Organizational Overview:

The mission of Comunidades is to amplify voices for environmental and social justice while increasing Latino/a/x engagement and leadership in Columbia River Gorge communities.

Comunidades was created in 2018 by Latino/a/x parents, activists, educators and other residents of the Gorge to address a need for a Latino/a/x-led environmental and social justice organization. Comunidades' core programs include:

- Campaigns for social and environmental justice: Comunidades works to advance social
 and environmental justice causes in the Columbia River Gorge in Washington and
 Oregon. Campaigns issues include: pesticides, affordable housing, toxic pollution in
 water and fish, climate change, and other issues of environmental injustice and
 community inequality.
- Educational training: Comunidades provides leadership development and public participation in trainings tailored to Latino/a/x communities.
- Youth mentorship: Comunidades provides mentor opportunities that develop skills and knowledge about community organizing and social and environmental justice issues.

The project's fiscal sponsor, Columbia Riverkeeper (Riverkeeper), has a 20-year history of working to protect clean water and our climate from high-impact industrial pollution, including coal, oil, and fracked gas terminals, and organizing communities for clean water.

Location: Hood River, OR (temporarily remote due to COVID-19)

Job Type: Full-time employee; Exempt. Start date flexible.

Job Purpose: The Program Director will fortify, manage, and further develop programs that build the capacity of Comunidades. The position is approximately 80% program work and 20% development. This is the first full-time, paid staff member for Comunidades.

Position Description:

The Program Director works closely with Comunidades volunteers to develop and implement strategic campaigns to engage Latino/a/x communities in the Columbia River Gorge in social and environmental justice issues. Specific duties include:

- <u>Develop and Implement Strategic Plans</u>: The Program Director works with Comunidades volunteers to develop and implement strategic plans to achieve Comunidades' campaign objectives.
- <u>Build Grassroots Power</u>: The Program Director empowers Columbia River Gorge Latino/a/x communities to engage in social and environmental justice issues. This includes: building and maintaining grassroots volunteer infrastructure, recruiting new activists by

- phone-banking or attending events, and training and developing activist leaders.
- <u>Development</u>: The Program Director will fundraise, including applying for and reporting on grants for the organization.
- Communicate to Members and Public: The Program Director will communicate
 Comunidades' campaign work to the public by organizing virtual and in-person events,
 speaking in public, and using web-based organizing tools. The Program Director also drafts
 social media content, emails, fact sheets, website posts, press releases, and other
 communications.
- <u>Communicate to the Media</u>: The Program Director serves as an ambassador for Comunidades in the media.
- <u>Coordinate with Staff at Other Nonprofits</u>: The Program Director will maintain regular communications with staff at other nonprofits on campaign matters and emerging issues.
- <u>Supervise</u>: The Program Director will supervise contractors and mentor volunteers and interns on a periodic basis. The Program Director may supervise other employees in the future.
- Other program, communications, and development support duties as needed.

Desired experience and qualifications:

- Previous experience working with volunteers.
- Strong organizational skills and ability to manage multiple projects and meet deadlines.
- Demonstrated interest and knowledge about building power in Latino/a/x communities, social justice advocacy, and environmental justice.
- Understanding of and commitment to advancing equity, diversity, and inclusion. An interest in learning about, or lived experience understanding, Latino/a/x communities in the Pacific Northwest.
- Experience fundraising or managing budgets.
- Two years or more experience as a community organizer, campaigner, executive director, paid activist, or other similar experience.
- Excellent public speaking and interpersonal communication skills.
- Proven ability to work independently and in a team environment.
- Bilingual (Spanish and English).
- Driver's license.

Preferred experience (not required):

- Familiarity with posting on social media (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram etc.)
- Experience with Google Products (Google Documents, Sheets, and Calendar).
- Experience supervising staff or interns.
